

Biography: David K. Mears, Senior Assistant Attorney General, Ecology Division

David Mears is the Senior Assistant Attorney General responsible for managing the Ecology Division of the Washington State Office of the Attorney General. He has served in this position since December 1998. Prior to joining the Washington State Attorney General's Office, David served as Counselor for State and Local Environmental Affairs to the Assistant Attorney General for the Environment and Natural Resources Division in the U.S. Department of Justice. David has also worked for the State of Texas in the Texas Office of State-Federal Relations as Energy and Environment Policy Director, the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission as Senior Attorney, and the Texas Office of the Attorney General as an Assistant Attorney General. David Mears received a B.S. in Environmental Engineering Technology from the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Cornell University in 1985 and a joint degree (J.D. and Masters of Studies in Environmental Law) from Vermont Law School in 1991.
