Thank you Chairman Inhofe, Ranking Member Reed, and distinguished members of the Committee. It is a great privilege to appear before you today as you consider my nomination to be the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Sustainment.

Thank you Senator Perdue for your kind introduction. I would also like to thank the President for nominating me and Secretary Esper and Under Secretary Lord for their confidence in me and providing the support of their talented staff throughout the process. I am humbled and truly grateful to have the opportunity to continue to serve the nation.

I'd like to acknowledge my wife, Leigh Ann, who is here with me today and who has supported me always, especially through my deployment to Iraq while she was pregnant with our first child.
