STATEMENT OF MATTHEW P. DONOVAN SASC CONFIRMATION HEARING TO BE UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR PERSONNEL AND READINESS March 10, 2020 at 9:30 AM

Chairman Inhofe, Ranking Member Reed, distinguished members of the committee, thank you for your long-standing and unwavering support for the Department of Defense and for the men and women who defend our great nation. I also thank Secretary Wilkie for his leadership and his kind words here today. If confirmed, it will be my great honor to assist Secretary Esper in leading the DoD's nearly three million Active, Guard, and Reserve service members and Civilians, as the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness. We must also provide them the cuttingedge tools of the trade they need to be successful, and state-of-the-art training technologies and techniques to best hone their skills.

Our Total Force Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines, and Civilians deserve the best leadership, the best policies, the best equipment, the best education and training, and our Service members and their families deserve the best healthcare, best support systems, and best quality of life we can possibly provide, for the sacrifices we ask them to endure.

If confirmed, it will be my honor to work every day with Secretary Esper, the millions of men and women of the Department of Defense, and the Congress, to ensure your Department of Defense sustains the ability to defend and deter, and if necessary, defeat our nation's adversaries.
